Population and Housing Narrative Profile: 2010-2012

2010-2012 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.


## Households and Families

In 2010-2012 there were 48,000 households in Lansing city, Michigan. The average household size was 2.4 people.

Families made up 54 percent of the households in Lansing city, Michigan. This figure includes both married-couple families (30 percent) and other families (24 percent). Of other families, 11 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 46 percent of all households in Lansing city, Michigan. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Lansing city, Michigan, 29 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 19 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.

Among persons 15 and older, 36 percent of males and 33 percent of females are currently married.

In Lansing city, Michigan, 2,600 grandparents lived with their grandchildren under 18 years old. Of those grandparents, 36 percent of them had financial responsibility for their grandchildren.

## Nativity and Foreign Born


Ninety-two percent of the people living in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012 were native residents of the United States. Seventy-three percent of these residents were living in the state in which they were born.

Eight percent of the people living in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012 were foreign born. Of the foreign born population, 30 percent were naturalized U.S. citizens, and 83 percent entered the country before the year 2010. Seventeen percent of the foreign born entered the country in 2010 or later.

Foreign born residents of Lansing city, Michigan come from different parts of the world.

## Language


Among people at least five years old living in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012, 13 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 43 percent spoke Spanish and 57 percent spoke some other language; 46 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."



## Geographic Mobility

In 2010-2012, 77 percent of the people at least one year old living in Lansing city, Michigan were living in the same residence one year earlier.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012




## Education

In 2010-2012, 25 percent of people 25 years and over had a high school diploma or equivalency and 24 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Fifteen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Lansing city, Michigan was 35,000 in 2010-2012. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 3,400 and elementary or high school enrollment was 16,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 15,000.

## Disability

In Lansing city, Michigan, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2010-2012, 17 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 7 percent of people under 18 years old, to 17 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 44 percent of those 65 and over.

## Employment Status and Type of Employer


In Lansing city, Michigan, 56 percent of the population 16 and over were employed; 34 percent were not currently in the labor force.

Seventy-eight percent of the people employed were private wage and salary workers; 17 percent were federal, state, or local government workers; and 5 percent were self-employed in their own (not incorporated) business.



## Commuting to Work

Seventy-eight percent of Lansing city, Michigan workers drove to work alone in 2010-2012, and 10 percent carpooled. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 19 minutes to get to work.


Percent of Workers 16 and over Commuting by Mode in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012



## Income


The median income of households in Lansing city, Michigan was \$34,420. Twenty-three percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 1 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.

Seventy-six percent of the households received earnings and 19 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-seven percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$15,908. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


Proportion of Households with Various Income Sources in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012



## Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2010-2012, 30 percent of people were in poverty. Forty-two percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 10 percent of people 65 years old and over. Twenty-four percent of all families and 46 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012




## Health Insurance

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012, 87 percent had health insurance coverage and 13 percent did not have health insurance coverage. For those under 18 years of age, 4 percent had no health insurance coverage. The civilian noninstitutionalized population had both private and public health insurance, with 55 percent having private coverage and 44 percent having public coverage.

## Population

In 2010-2012, Lansing city, Michigan had a total population of 114,000 - 59,000 (52 percent) females and 54,000 (48 percent) males. The median age was 32.1 years. Twenty-three percent of the population was under 18 years and 10 percent was 65 years and older.

## The Age Distribution of People in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012




For people reporting one race alone, 67 percent were White; 24 percent were Black or African American; 1 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 5 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 4 percent were Some other race. Eight percent reported Two or more races. Thirteen percent of the people in Lansing city, Michigan were Hispanic. Fifty-five percent of the people in Lansing city, Michigan were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

## Housing Characteristics

In 2010-2012, Lansing city, Michigan had a total of 55,000 housing units, 14 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 71 percent were in single-unit structures, 28 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 1 percent were mobile homes. Nine percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

## The Types of Housing Units in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012




The median number of rooms in all housing units in Lansing city, Michigan is 5. Of these housing units, 49 percent have three or more bedrooms.

### Occupied Housing Unit Characteristics

In 2010-2012, Lansing city, Michigan had 48,000 occupied housing units - 25,000 (52 percent) owner occupied and 23,000 (48 percent) renter occupied. Sixty-eight percent of householders of these units had moved in since 2000. Seventy-two percent of the owner occupied units had a mortgage. Three percent of the households did not have telephone service. Twelve percent had no vehicles available and another 9 percent had three or more.

House heating fuel used in Lansing city, Michigan in 2010-2012



## Housing Costs

The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,045, nonmortgaged owners \$448, and renters \$714. Thirty-five percent of owners with mortgages, 17 percent of owners without mortgages, and 61 percent of renters in Lansing city, Michigan spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.

Explanation of Symbols:

1. An '\*\*\*' entry in the margin of error column indicates that either no sample observations or too few sample observations were available to compute a standard error and thus the margin of error. A statistical test is not appropriate.
2. An '-' entry in the estimate column indicates that either no sample observations or too few sample observations were available to compute an estimate, or a ratio of medians cannot be calculated because one or both of the median estimates falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
3. An '-' following a median estimate means the median falls in the lowest interval of an open-ended distribution.
4. An '+' following a median estimate means the median falls in the upper interval of an open-ended distribution.
5. An '\*\*\*' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the median falls in the lowest interval or upper interval of an open-ended distribution. A statistical test is not appropriate.
6. An '\*\*\*\*\*' entry in the margin of error column indicates that the estimate is controlled. A statistical test for sampling variability is not appropriate.
7. An 'N' entry in the estimate and margin of error columns indicates that data for this geographic area cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small.
8. An '(X)' means that the estimate is not applicable or not available.
